Wednesday July 7th 11am-12:30pm Animal Tail Art with Carol Hanson

Esteemed artist, Carol Hanson, makes a very special visit to Effingham with her paints and supplies! Participants will paint animal bodies and on a separate piece of paper we'll paint animal tails. Next, we'll throw all the tails into a box, mix them up, and then attach the new tail onto the original animal. Then we'll write a tale about our new commingled creatures.

Thursday July 15th 1pm-2pm Frog Discovery time with GMCG

Join EB Brandt from Green Mountain Conservation Group in learning all about frogs! We'll be reading "Growing Frogs" by Vivian French and illustrated by Alison Bartlett. We will also learn about what it means to be an amphibian, what is metamorphosis, and what frogs we can find in our backyards! We will play a game, create a frog puppet craft, and interact with **live frogs** from the GMCG vernal pool.

Tuesday July 20th 11am-12pm Tin Mountain's Busy Beavers

Every animal is marvelously adapted to the place and the way it lives. The beaver may be the perfect example: many of its body parts and behaviors are unique in the animal world. In this program Tin Mountain naturalist, Dexter Harding, will show various beaver body parts such as pelts, skulls, teeth, and feet while explaining how these body parts give the beaver "super powers". Then Dexter will guide us in drawing the beaver's world as it transforms a small creek into a pond with a versatile dwelling!
